## BritBox

**Agatha Christie's Partners in Crime** - 9/22 - Francesca Annis (*Bancroft*) and James Warwick (*Iron Man*) star as the famous crime-fighting duo, Tommy and Tuppence Beresford, as they solve mysteries and search for enemy spies in 1950's Britain. In this adaptation, our two sleuths are now married and well-established as secret agents working under the watchful eye of Scotland Yard.

**Last Night of the Proms** - 9/12 - For those not familiar with the BBC Proms, it's an eight-week series of classical concerts held annually in London. The "Last Night of the Proms" is quite different from the other nights, taking place on the second Saturday in September with widespread broadcast. The concert usually features some lighter classics and then a second half consisting of patriotic British pieces (like Henry Wood's "Fantasia on British Sea Songs" and Thomas Arne's "Rule, Britannia!").

**McDonald & Dodds** - 9/1 - BAFTA-winner Jason Watkins (*The Crown*, *Trollied*) stars alongside newcomer Tala Gouveia in this fun detective drama that's not quite cozy, but still far from gritty. The two-part series is set in Bath, England and it follows an incredibly mismatched but competent pair as they learn to work together to solve difficult cases.

**Moving On, Season 10** - 9/8 - This drama anthology offers contemporary stories of people experiencing big changes in their lives. Whether it's a couple dealing with infidelity or a family losing a loved one, each story is about change.

**Pride & Prejudice, Remastered** - 9/25 - Though the 1995 version of the classic is

already on BritBox, this release is a remastered edition.

**This Farming Life, Season 4** - 9/18 - This BAFTA-winning documentary series returns, following the ups and downs of new farming families in Scotland and Northern Ireland as they face tough economic times and an uncertain future.

## Netflix

**Criminal UK, Series 2** - 9/16 - This crime anthology series is set within the confines of a London police interrogation room where skilled professionals play psychological games to get important details from suspects.

**The Duchess** - 9/11 - Canadian comedian Katherine Ryan stars in this comedy based on her life as a single mother in London. Though estranged from the father of her child, she debates having another child with him, or possibly using a sperm donor to reproduce.

**Enola Holmes** - 9/23 - Millie Bobby Brown (*Intruders*) stars as Enola Holmes, the clever little sister of Sherlock Holmes. The film is based on the Enola Holmes novels by Nancy Springer.

**Jack Whitehall: Travels with My Father, Season 4** - 9/22 - This travelling father-son duo returns for another season of hilarious scenarios and misunderstandings.

**Michael McIntyre: Showman** - 9/15 - British comedian Michael McIntyre performs a standup special shot live in London.

## HBO & HBO Max

**Doctor Who, Season 12** - 9/1 - HBO Max will air the most recent season of this British sci-fi classic, currently featuring Jodie Whittaker (*Broadchurch*) as the Doctor.

**The Great Pottery Throw Down** - TBD - *HBO Max only* - This competition series sets out to find the UK's best home potter. Seasons 1-3 will be premiering on HBO Max.

**His Dark Materials, Season 2** - November - Philip Pullman's fantasy trilogy continues with another seven episodes that will see our young heroes Lyra and Will taking their first steps into a new universe.

**The Murders at White House Farm** - 9/24 - *HBO Max only* - This dramatized true crime series tells the story of a gruesome, multi-generational family murder that took place at an isolated farm more than 30 years ago. The miniseries stars Freddie Fox (*Year of the Rabbit*), Mark Addy (*New Blood*), Stephen Graham (*The Virtues*), and Gemma Whelan (*Gentleman Jack*).

**The Third Day** - 9/14 - This six-part series sees Jude Law playing Sam, a man who's strangely drawn to an island off the coast of Great Britain. When he arrives, he finds a group of islanders intent on preserving their way of life, no matter the cost.

## Sundance Now

**River** - 9/10 - Stellan Skarsgård, Nicola Walker, and Lesley Manville star in this series about a brilliant police officer haunted by guilt.

## Prime Video

**The Crimson Field** - 9/1 - At a busy WWI hospital, Kitty volunteers in an attempt to escape her past.

**George Gently** - 9/1 - Inspector George Gently and DS Bacchus chase criminals in the 1960's in Northeast England.

**Keeping Faith, Season 1** - 9/1 - A Welsh lawyer cuts her maternity leave short when her husband goes missing. As she tries to solve the crime before she's arrested for it, she finds herself knee-deep in the criminal underworld of her small town. Eve Myles (*Torchwood*) stars, though some might argue her yellow anorak deserves a mention, too.

## Peacock

**Departure** - 9/17 - Partially filmed in the UK, this Canadian series follows the mystery of Flight 716, a passenger plane that vanishes over the Atlantic Ocean. After the crash, talented aviation investigator is called in to locate survivors and make sense of what happened.

**I Hate Suzie** - TBD - Billie Piper (*Doctor Who*) stars in this series about a celebrity whose phone is hacked, exposing some very compromising photos.

**Noughts & Crosses** - 9/4 - This six-episode drama takes place in a world where racial politics are reversed. In its past, Africa colonised Europe, and the present is marred by segregation laws that preserve the power dynamic. With that world as the backdrop, it tells the story of two young lovers fighting against the system.
